FY22 Usage - A Closer Look

As compared to those closest in the rankings, the MPL is:

- Less staffed higher circ/FTE
- Less funded lower municipal appropriation

As compared to the top libraries in our population cohort (52):

- Population & Total Circ 18th
- Circ per capita 14th
- Circ per FTE 12th
- Appropriation 17th
- Appropriation per capita 17th



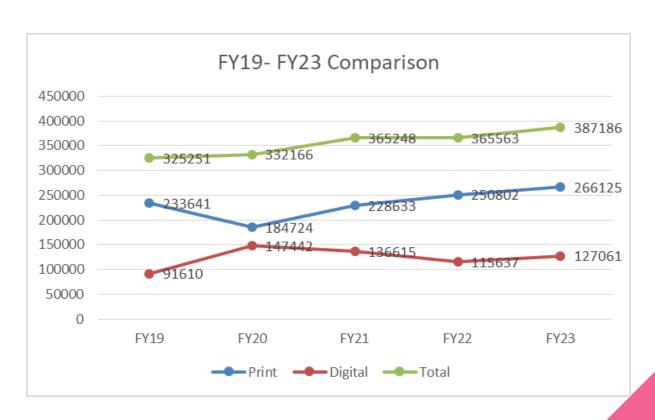
Total usage is up

• 19% increase over five years

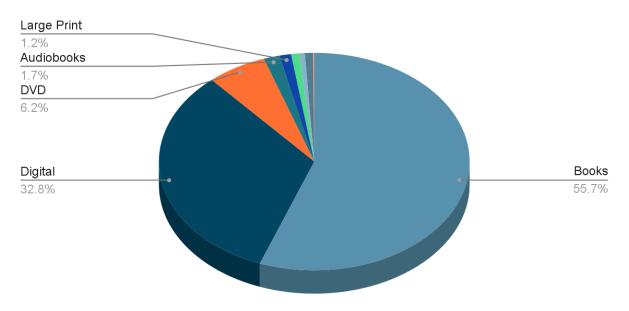
There are fluctuations in usage

- Entering a 'post-COVID' library environment
- Digital numbers up year over year; not as high as peak COVID years
 - 38% increase over five years
- Physical usage is increasing, and better than pre-COVID
 - 14% increase over five years

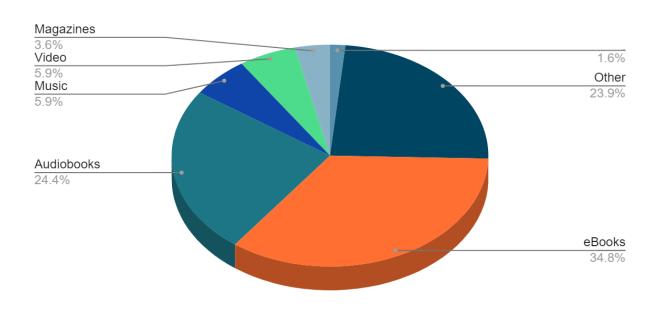




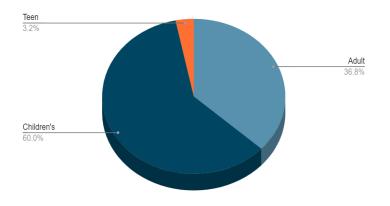
FY23 USAGE BY FORMAT



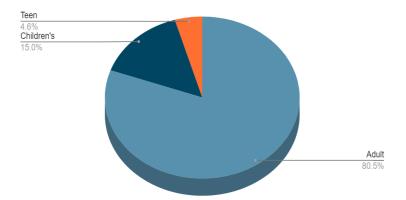
FY23 ECONTENT USAGE BY CATEGORY



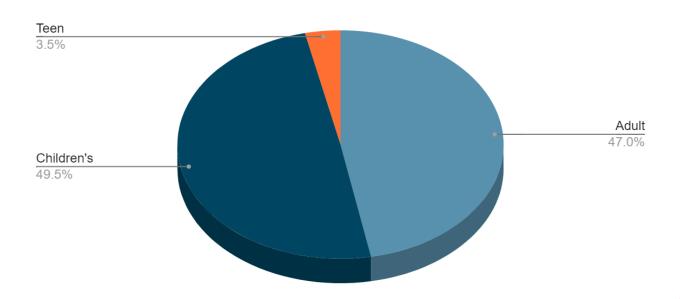
FY Print Usage by Age

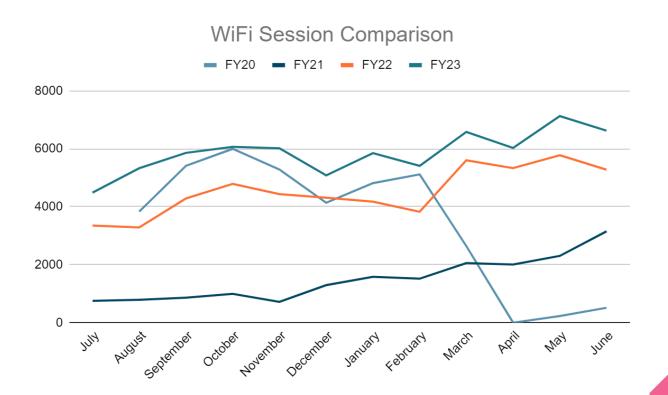


FY Digital Usage by Age



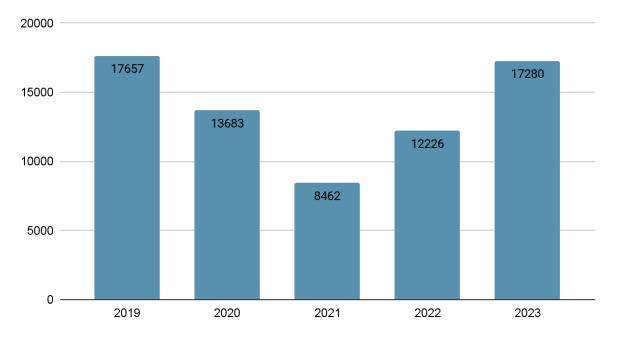
FY Total Usage by Age





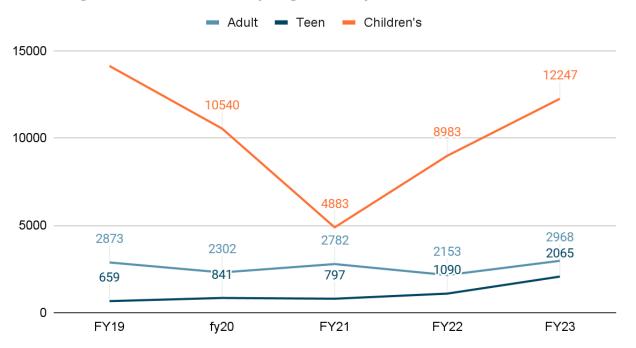

FY Program Attendance by Age Group

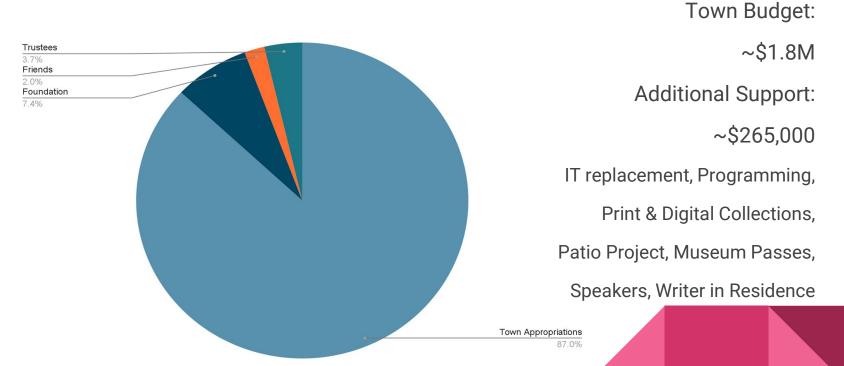


FY23 Highlights/Improvements

- -Implemented the five-year strategic plan
- -Fine Free for all initiative
- -Milton Grows year long initiative \$10K grant
- -PLA Grant Financial Literacy programming
- -Outreach 1st annual open house

 - New staff: Abbey Branco & Nikki Wright



FY24 Budget



5-Year Plan Summary (Year 2) - Trustees or Capitol

- 1. Sorter \$40,000 annually > moved to operating in FY24
- 2. IT Infrastructure replacement \$50,000 annually
 - FY23 upgrades partially covered by Town IT budget
- 3. 1.5 Library Positions Overall cost: \$114,000 (includes staffing for potential neighborhood initiatives) > PT position funded in FY24
- 4. Town Capital (generator, HVAC, carpets, parking) Overall cost: \$590,000

5-Year Plan Summary (Year 2) - Trustees or Capitol

- 5. Trustee updates (furniture, carpet, parking) Overall cost: \$165,000
 - Patio accessibility project started
 - Parking conversations continue with MPIC
- 6. Director and Staff development \$10,000 annually
- 7. Writer In Residence \$10,000 annually
 - Hallie Touger selected for FY24

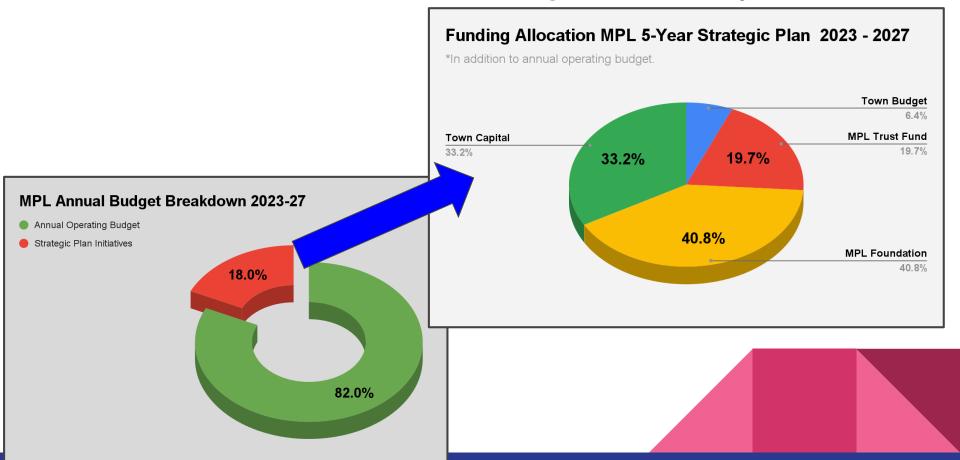
5-Year Plan and Budget Summary - Foundation

- 1. Increased Neighborhood Access initiative Potential overall cost: \$450,000
 - Needs assessment completed in FY23; first step = onsite 24hr book lockers
- 2. Speaker Series Overall cost: \$125,000
 - Geraldine Brooks will be the first in the series; followed by Eric Litwin
- 3. Books & Materials \$65,000 \$75,000 annually

5-Year Plan and Budget Summary - Friends

- 1. Museum Passes \$5,000 annually
- 2. Library Programming \$30,000 \$40,000 annually

FY24 Town Budget

- Adds much needed PT library assistant position
- Completely funds books & materials to the State Minimum Requirement
- Increases to IT and Equipment Maintenance to reflect new wireless printing and sorter contracts
- Reflects changes in new union contract (3 year duration)
- Increased electricity funding
- Otherwise Status Quo

MPL's Strategic Priorities

- 1. The Library is Milton's Community Hub, offering a safe, comfortable, and user-friendly space.
- 2. The Library will provide excellent customer service and feature the expertise of its staff.
- 3. The Library will offer access to a wide variety of collections and services, while also promoting innovative ideas and initiatives to all members of our community.
- 4. The Library will be a destination for residents of all ages to explore programming activities for enjoyment, information, and increasing awareness.
