• 17% increase over five years

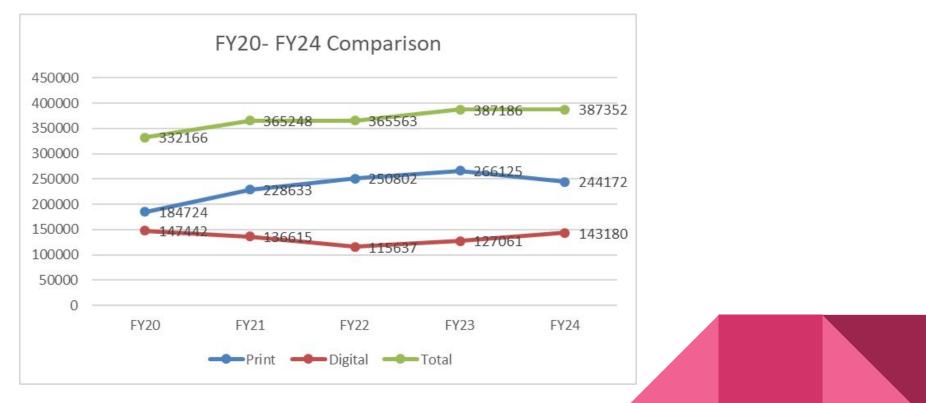
There are fluctuations in usage

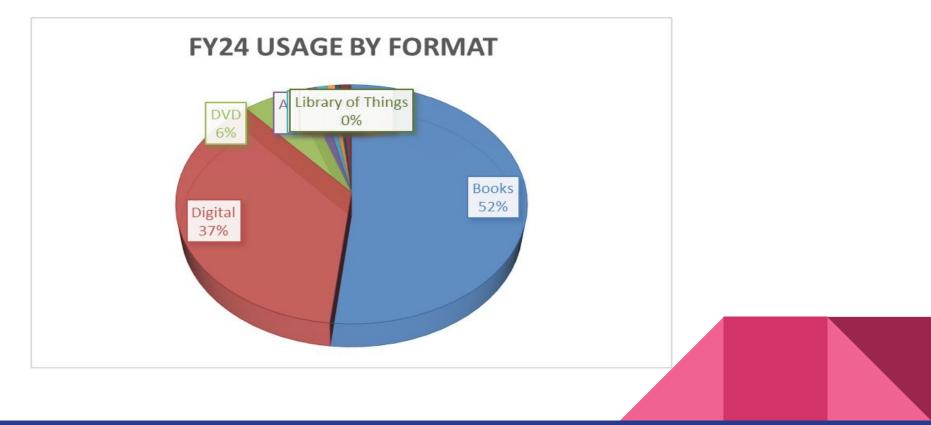
- Digital numbers up year over year

 - \circ Slight decrease over FY23, but above five year average of 234,000

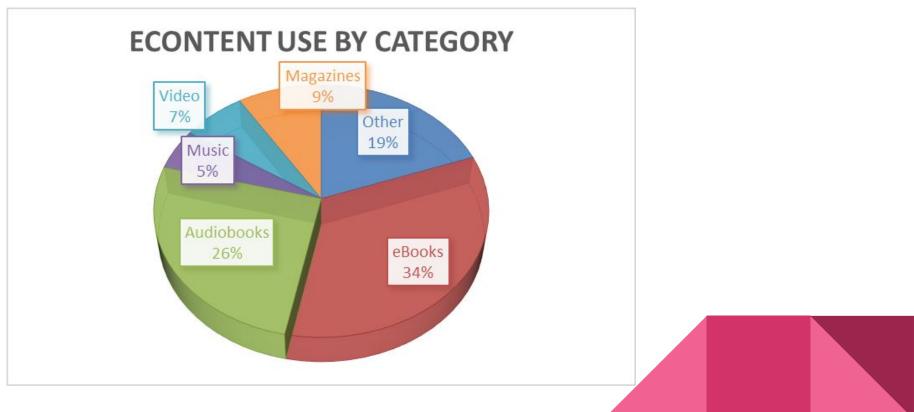


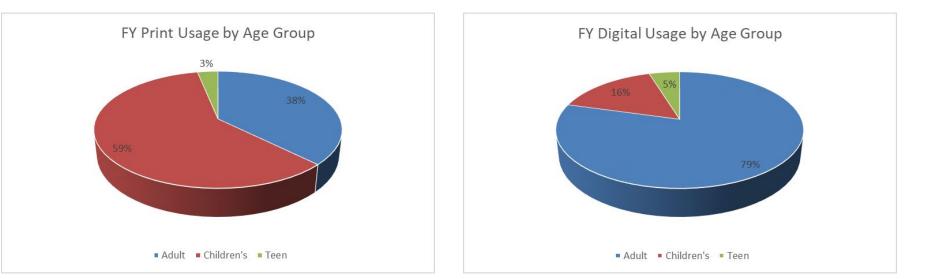


FY24 In Review: Circulation History

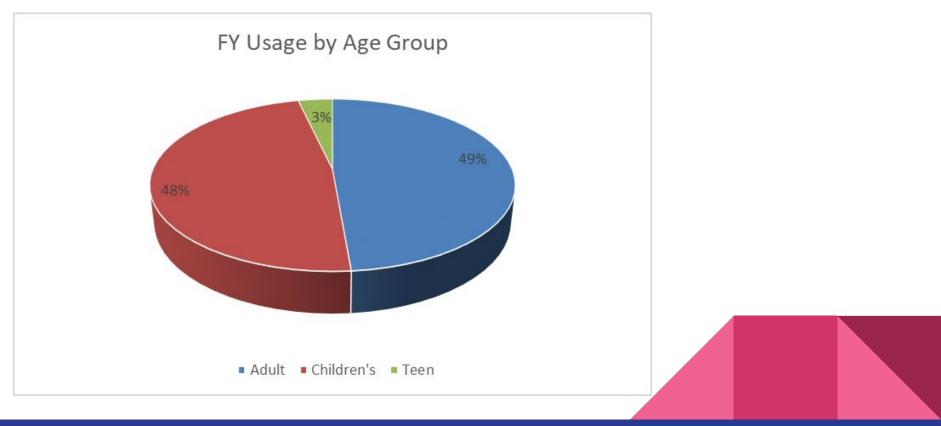


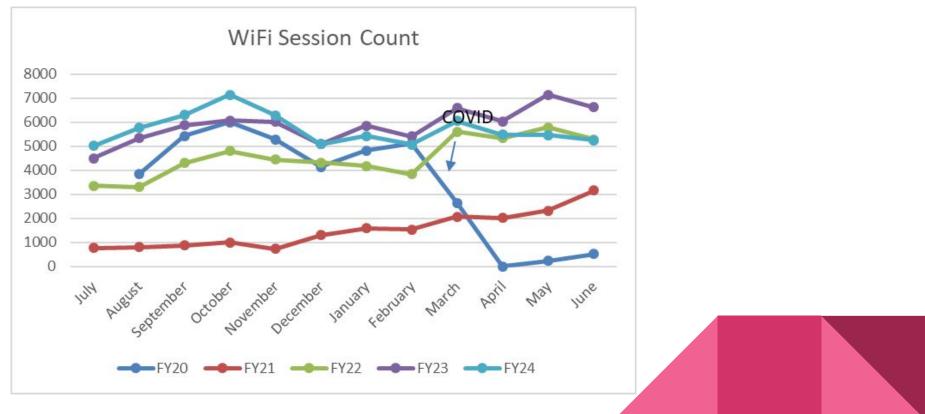




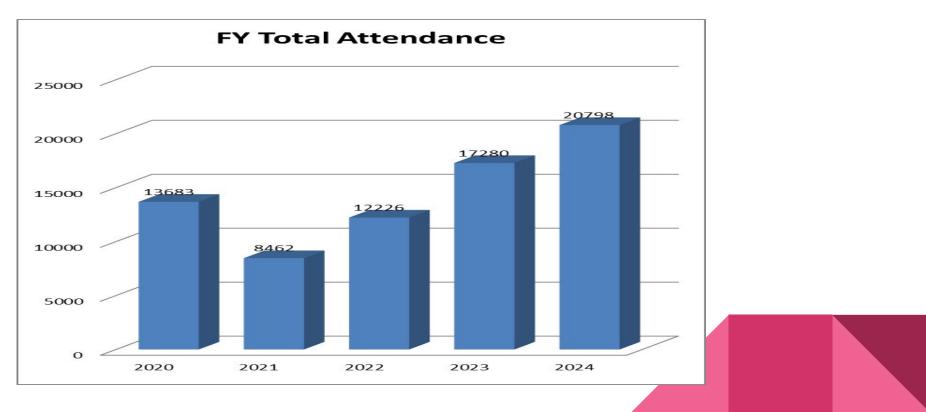




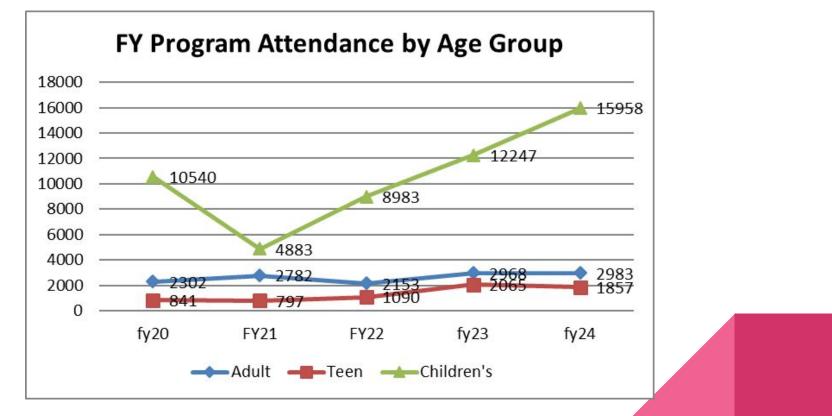

5-Year Plan Summary (Year 3) - Trustees or Capitol

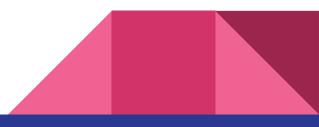
- 1. Sorter \$40,000 annually > moved to operating in FY24
- 2. IT Infrastructure replacement \$50,000 annually
 - FY23 & FY24 upgrades partially covered by Town IT budget
- 1.5 Library Positions Overall cost: \$114,000 (includes staffing for outreach & programming) > PT position funded in FY24
- 4. Town Capital (generator, HVAC, carpets, parking) Overall cost: \$590,000



5-Year Plan Summary (Year 3) - Trustees or Capitol

5. Trustee updates (furniture, carpet, parking) - Overall cost: \$165,000

- Patio accessibility project completed
- Parking conversations continue with MPIC; drawings & solutions phase

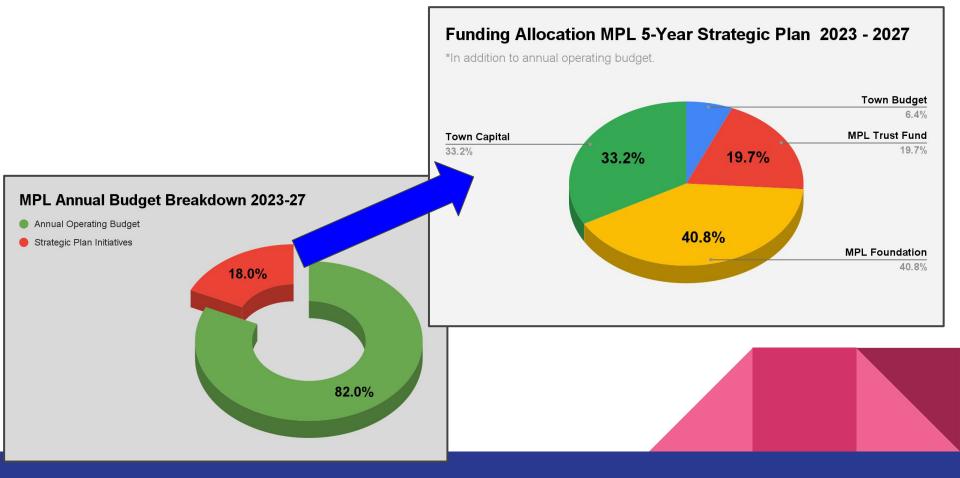

FY25 Town Budget

- Maintains staffing at status quo
 - Some shifting in hours of part time staff
- Completely funds books & materials to the State Minimum Requirement
- Final year of staff union contract (end June 30, 2025)
- Inflationary increases to utilities and other maintenance expenses
- Still unfunded
 - Full Time Professional Librarian position
 - Part Time Professional Librarian position
 - These would meet increasing programming, outreach, & publicity/social media needs
- FY26 Override Year ???
